

# Recognizing Habitats

## A Field Workshop

Hudsonia and the Hudson River Estuary Program offer this **outdoor workshop** for municipal officials and land trust staff to increase their ability to recognize and evaluate major habitat types.



We will use maps and aerial photos to help interpret the landscape, and discuss features and quality indicators for important habitats such as meadow, forest edge, interior forest, acidic ledge, marsh, hardwood swamp, and perennial and intermittent streams. We will also discuss considerations related to land development and habitat conservation.

The workshop is especially for members of **municipal planning boards, conservation advisory councils, zoning boards of appeal, staff of land trusts**, and other agencies that are regularly reviewing land development proposals, advising landowners and developers, and making land management or regulatory decisions.
