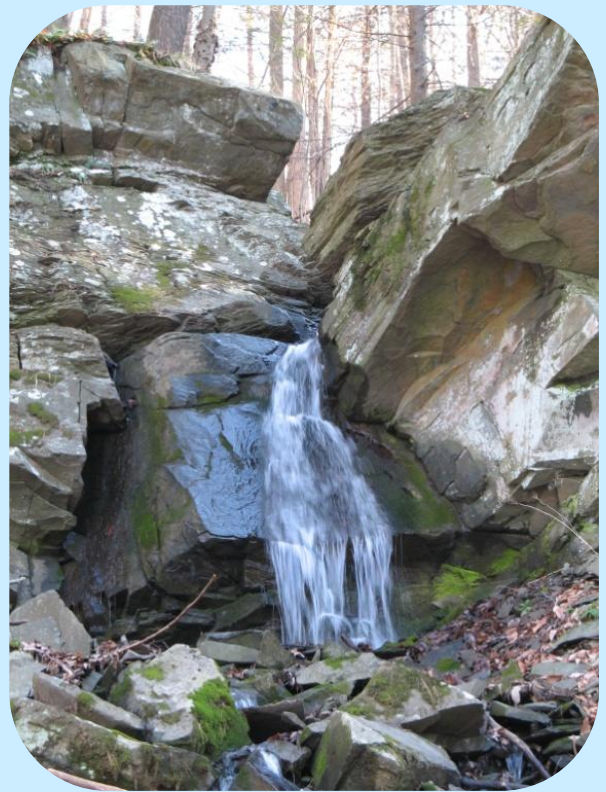


Small Streams: Values, Threats, and Protection

Hudsonia and the Hudson River Estuary Program are pleased to offer a new two-part **evening workshop** and **field trip** on the importance of small streams.

Through presentations, map analysis exercises, and field observations we will discuss the **ecological values** of small streams, **how to identify** unmapped streams on site plans, other maps, using online tools, and in the field; **threats** to stream habitats and water quality; the status of state and federal **regulatory programs** for small streams; and how to extend **local protections** to these important resources.



The workshop is especially for municipal officials, including members of **planning boards** and **conservation advisory councils**, and for members of **watershed groups**, **land trust staff**, and others who are regularly engaged in townwide planning, reviewing land development proposals, advising landowners, or making land management or regulatory decisions.
